


Figure 83. Illustrations of one ópalo (top left) and two obsidian (top right, bottom) small bifacial projectile points.




Figure 85. Illustrations of a carved bone bead (left), and a bright purple sodalite bead (right).




Figure 86. Illustrations of four copper artifacts from central zone units, Jachakala Period: the top two are *tupu* needles, and the bottom are fragments of personal adornments (the bottom right is possibly a fragment of a piece resembling that on the bottom left).





Figure 87. Illustrations of four additional copper artifacts from Jachakala: the left two are possibly fragments of personal adornments, and the right two are small, flat fragments of unknown objects.






Figure 88. Illustrations of two decorated faunal fragments, one with double incised and painted lines (top), and one hollowed, perforated fragment of a possible flute or snuff tube.
