Open Access author fees fund (<http://oscp.library.pitt.edu/author-fees-fund/>)

Through the Open Access Author Fee Fund, the University Library System provides funds for the payment of article processing fees for eligible Pitt authors who publish in eligible Open Access journals. Pitt is part of an elite group of universities supporting Open Access to scholarly research by subsidizing author fees for high-quality Open Access journals.

Measuring scholarly impact

For as long as scholars have been publishing their research, there has been interest in determining the impact of those publications. We are implementing a new service with Plum Analytics (<http://www.plumanalytics.com>) to capture research sharing—through both traditional and contemporary methods—to present a fuller picture of your scholarly impact.

When fully implemented, our service will

- Provide a tool for measuring and visualizing research impact
- Gather this information in one place
- Make it intelligible and useful to scholars
