

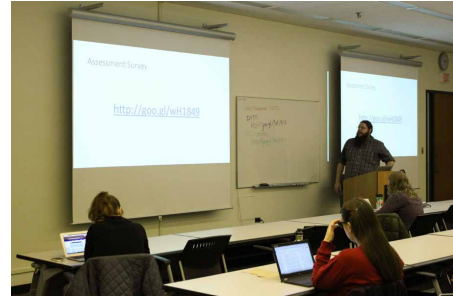
Digital Scholarship: Workshops and Class Partnerships
