PHOTOVOICE & RECRUITMENT


- Photovoice is a qualitative method that uses photos to capture participants feelings on a particular subject




This is against the wall on the third floor, with study chairs looking out a window.

Studying by a Window




In this picture I am sitting at a table doing work on my own.
